Free Trade: Whom does it serve?

Miguel Pickard, an economist, researcher and Mexican citizen, will respond to this question during an August 25 presentation on the global economy and its effects on the human communities in countries subjected to Free Trade Agreements.

His topics include Free Trade Agreements, labor practices and the environmental impact of transnational companies.
