"There is a scene in The Gymnast in which the protagonist, Jane, is suspended in midair, wrapped in a giant strand of silk that she's using as part of her Cirque du Soleil-like aerial routine. Director's Statement -

"When you're spending investors money, you make a slasher film. When you spend your own, you get to do something a little more scary, like make a drama," laughs writer/director Ned Farr. "Fortunately, we could green-light ourselves, so we got to dig into issues that have a richness and complexity to them. A failing marriage, now there's something scary. Stepping over the gender line for the first time, that discovery that you're a three on the Kinsey scale, that's a feast of emotion all to itself! There's also the adultery angle. I just find it fascinating that in our real lives there is so much condemnation around a subject that gets reflected back to us in our culture, through our stories and movies, in a way that makes adultery not only understandable, but also sometimes transformative. How many people even registered that *The Bridges of Madison County* was about adultery? It certainly wasn't part of the advertising campaign. The reason forbidden love is so moving in books and films and not in life is because in stories we get to see and feel both sides, whereas in life, almost by definition, you can't."

"Another compelling issue is how a woman measures her worth when she no longer is able to have children, especially if she hasn't yet had one. There is all manner of rationalizing that goes into taking the sting out of crossing that threshold, but the thought of it...I don't know, I just found myself profoundly moved by that transition. Everything else in the story branches out from there. There's a direct emotional connection between Jane's body failing her at a critical moment during her gymnastic career and it failing her as a potential mother. And so many other facets of Jane's character are compelling. She spent 6 to 8 hours a day training over the course of many years to achieve one goal, Olympic gold, only to have all that training come to nothing. What do you do with that? In her case, it led to a refusal to really commit to anything ever again, to stay small. It's such a beautiful and ironic moment when she does her balance beam routine for the police officer at the film's end. Her past comes around full circle. Her training did have a purpose. It's the singular thing that allows her journey to continue. I love that."

"The question I've been asked is why this film, why now? I can only think that, aside from the fact that the themes have resonance for me, this is the kind of story you rarely see. You don't see many movies made about women in their forties. It's almost as if there weren't hundreds of millions of them walking around. Certainly being married to Dreya provided a little inspiration!"

Synopsis -

Short Version

Jane, a former elite gymnast, when confronted with age and infertility, searches to give her life new meaning. Caught between an over-bearing husband and a possessive former teammate, she finds escape in a Cirque Du Soleil-type aerial act... and in the arms of another.

Long Version

Jane Hawkins (Dreya Weber) was once one of America's top gymnasts, but events and injury prevented her from fulfilling her Olympic destiny. Almost twenty years have passed in obscurity, working hand to mouth as a massage therapist while slowly disappearing in a passionless marriage. In an attempt to give meaning to her life, she has been secretly trying to get pregnant, against her husband David's wishes. Though still in peak condition, her doctor informs her that she may have waited too long to have children. And without David's money, she can't afford the fertility drugs that might make the difference.

A chance meeting with Denise, a former gymnastic teammate, provokes Jane to reexamine her life and past. While visiting a gymnasium, she is recognized by a coach, who recruits Jane for a completely different kind of venture: being part of a Cirque Du Soleil type of aerial act.

Also recruited to be part of the act is an enigmatic dancer named Serena. When events force the coach out of the project, Jane and Serena attempt to put the act together themselves, and in the process, fall in love. After Denise convinces her the affair with Serena is a form of denial, Jane must choose between having a child with her suddenly willing husband, or creating a completely new life for herself.

— Biography —

NED FARR, Writer/Director

A graduate of the Film School at SUNY Purchase in New York, Farr has been involved in production for over 17 years, from preproduction storyboard artist to post production editor, and well as a long stint as a gaffer on many commercials, music videos, and features.

Ned Farr's most recent film *How to Ace an Intervention* won Best Short Film at the DV Film Festival '04 and the Durango Film Festival '05, also winning a screenwriting award from the HypeFest for its screenplay. He also wrote, directed and edited three other short films; *Dream A Little Dream For Me* which premiered at the Seattle International Film Festival, *The Contractor* and *The Catcher*. His short films have been screened at over 30 film festivals nationwide. Ned has also directed music videos for various artists, including Jesse Hultberg, The Blue Thumbs, and Plato.

Also a singer-songwriter, Ned has released three CD's of original music, *Desert Motel* which is available at iTunes, and Amazon.com, and *The Good Red Road* and *Indian Summer* which are available at www.nedfarr.com.

Ned is currently in developement with two original screenplays.

MARCO FARGNOLI, Director of Photography

Marco Fargnoli, a native of Dayton, Ohio, and graduate of Wright State University, began his career in Chicago's grassroots film community. After relocating to Los Angeles in the late 90's, he began shooting independent features and music videos. His work has been seen several times at the Sundance Film Festival, and his TV documentary work includes projects for NBC, FOX, Lifetime, and the History Channel.

The Act, a Sundance 2005 short film, was just honored this past Spring by inclusion in the Cinematographers Guild Showcase for Excellence in Cinematography. The features and short films he's shot have picked up other awards at Aspen Independent (Best Feature Cinematography), Houston Worldfest, BACA, Durango, and Cinequest film festivals. In addition to THE GYMNAST, Marco's latest projects are the indy feature Race You to the Bottom, Forever, and the award-winning short film How to Ace an Intervention, directed by Ned Farr.

Marco is currently in pre-production for *The Hammer*.

CRAIG RICHEY, Composer

A native of North Carolina, Craig graduated from the Juilliard School of Music in NYC.

Craig began scoring films in NY. His first score, indy film When It's Over, won critical praise in the LA weekly, and Variety after being screened at the first Newport Beach Film Festival. He also scored Nicole Holofcener's Lovely and Amazing (starring Catherine Keener, Brenda Blethen, Emily Mortimer, Jake Gyllenhaal and Dermot Mulroney), and Ned Farr's short film The Catcher, starring Dreya Weber. His most recent film, Friends With Money, written and directed by Holofcener and starring Jennifer Aniston, Catherine Keener, Francis McDormand and Joan Cusack, opened the 2006 Sundance Film Festival and nationally in April of 2006.

Also a singer-songwriter, Craig's songs appear both in *Lovely And Amazing* and *Friends With Money*. Craig has released a record of original Christmas songs titled *Mother & Child*, Songs of Christmas' available at iTunes, Amazon.com, and CDbaby.

MICHAEL CARP, Producer

A native New Yorker, Michael Carp came out to Los Angeles on the late '80s to pursue a career in film. Carp worked in entertainment, advertising & technology during the tech-boom, and in 1994 Carp opened Lunarfish, a Production & VFX Company.

Lunarfish was one of the key teams that created the stunning visual effects in the painted worlds of the film *What Dreams May Come* which won them the Academy Award for best Visual Effects and the very prestigious Prix Pixel-INA: Imagina Award.

Among other spots for D&G, AMC Theaters & La Fee Absinthe, Lunarfish also won the AICP Award and Cannes & Clio Award shortlists for *Bullet Factory*. Other Indie films include *Olé*, *Venice Underground*, *RienCarNation*, and *The Basement*.

— Biography ——

DREYA WEBER Actor (Jane)/Producer

Dreya has acted extensively in Film, Television, and Theatre. She can be seen in Nicole Holofcener's Lovely and Amazing, Sharon Pollack's Everything Relative, and short films Dream A Little Dream For Me, which premiered at the Seattle International film festival, The Catcher, and The Contractor. She guest starred in several episodes of ABC's The Practice, the CBS/Paramount pilot Company Town, and has been in many commercials.

Dreya appeared on Broadway at the Roundabout, at the New York Shakespeare Festival, Circle-in-the-Square, and in many Off-Broadway and Regional theatre productions. In Los Angeles she played Vivien Leigh in the west coast premiere of Austin Pendleton's *Orson's Shadow*, (winner Ovation, LADCC, Garland Awards), and recently appeared in the third sold out run of *Le Club Seduce*, an aerial burlesque comedy that she co-wrote and co-produced.

Dreya spent 3 years traveling the world with Cher's *Living Proof Farewell Tour*. She choreographed all of the aerials in the show, and performed as a dancer and solo aerialist. The NBC broadcast of *Living Proof* won the 2003 Emmy for Best Musical Special. Dreya choreographed an aerial swing number for Madonna's *Re-Invention Tour*, and all of the aerials in Pink's *Try This* and *I'm Not Dead* tours.

Dreya's fascination with aerial arts began after her final season as an All-American gymnast at Hunter College. She happened across a trapeze rig while visiting her sister in Bloomington, Indiana. She quickly excelled and soon was performing flying trapeze in *The Moscow State Circus, Circus America*, and the *Royal Hanniford Circus*.

ADDIE YUNGMEE Actor (Serena)/Co-producer

THE GYMNAST marks Addie's film acting debut.

Addie is one of the dance world's most sought after performers, having toured the globe with Madonna, Janet Jackson, Pink, and Cher's Emmy-winning *Living Proof Farewell Tour*, in which she also performed as an aerialist. She is currently out on Madonna's 2006 *Confessions* tour.

Addie's film appearances as a dancer include: *Memoirs of a Geisha, Bowfinger, Collateral, Orange County,* and *Like Mike*. She has also appeared in numerous music videos: Madonna, Pink, No Doubt, Cher, Lenny Kravitz, Timberland and Magoo, Mick Jagger, Missy Elliot, and more.

ALLISON MACKIE Actor (Denise)

Allison Mackie began her career in New York at the Neighborhood Playhouse School of the Theater and the Actor's Studio.

Miss Mackie recently appeared in the indie film *Our Very Own* with Allison Janney. Other film credits include *Original Sin, Gia, Friends & Family, Rear Window, The Souler Opposite, The Stranger, Sliver, Schemes* and *Amos & Andrew*. Television: *Without A Trace, Law & Order SVU, Frasier, E.R. Undue Influence, Jack Reed 3* and *South Beach*.

Allison has appeared on Broadway as Roxane in *Cyrano De Bergerac* starring Frank Langella and with Joanne Woodward in *Candida*. Regionally she has worked with Miss Woodward in productions of *The Big Knife*, *La Ronde*, *Hay Fever*, *The Constant Wife* and most recently *David Copperfield*. Regional credits include *Peccadillo* (written & directed by Garson Kanin) *Midsummer Night's Dream*, *Romeo & Juliet*, *The Velvet Elvis*, *All The Way Home* and *Dear Brutus*.

MAM SMITH Actor (Nicole)

Mam graduated from New York University's Tish School of the Arts for Dance and Theater. She also received a Masters degree in communications from Emerson College in Boston.

Mam has appeared on *Law & Order: Special Victims Unit*, in the film *Stay* in numerous print and Television advertisements. Her choreographic contributions for the Broadway Musical *Nine* garnished the show two Tony awards and a broadcast mention. Mam designed Mariah Carey's aerials for the 2003 *Charmbracelet Tour*. Mam performed at Lincoln Center and Radio City Music Hall as a solo aerialist/dancer and toured through out the United States as a featured dancer with the Doug Elkins Dance Co.

Some of Mam's stunt credits include *The Bedford Diaries, The Family Stone, The Manchurian Candidate,* and *Angels In America*.

Biography —

DAVID DE SIMONE Actor (David)

David De Simone studied ballet at Julliard, and was considered something of a prodigy: he didn't start dancing until he was sixteen and flourished so quickly Julliard offered him a scholar-ship to continue his studies. While in New York he caught the acting bug and began pursuing it with equal intensity. But a simple cut on his hand led to a serious staph infection that permanently weakened his heart and caused him to wear a pacemaker for the rest of his life. This sudden bizarre turn of events changed the course of David's acting career, which for the most part lay dormant in the intervening 20 years before he stepped through our front door to audition for THE GYMNAST.

When Dreya and I met David, he had recently married a lovely gal named Autumn, and was thriving as a general contractor building and renovating houses. A few years earlier he had started taking acting classes again, dreaming of perhaps taking another shot at the biz, and so had put himself out there for any role that might fit. I didn't know that when I wrote the role of Jane's husband, I was writing it for him, had in fact already called his character 'David' years before we ever met, but this must have been the case because as soon as he sat down and started his audition we felt we'd found our man.

A few months after completing principle photography for THE GYMNAST, David suffered a fatal heart attack. The shock of this, the numbed incomprehension in the weeks that followed, was perhaps in time ameliorated by the small grace of seeing him every day on the computer screen as we edited his performance, knowing we'd helped him achieve a dream of his, and by knowing—knowing because he would freely admit it, that he was a very, very happy man.
