City Of West Hollywood Declares Itself "CITY OF REFUGE" For Same Sex Binational Couples

est Hollywood, CA,
November 6 - West
Hollywood City Council
voted unanimously in supporting civil
rights for its lesbian and gay residents by
passing a resolution declaring West

Hollywood as a "City of Refuge" for same-sex binational couples. Passing this resolution marks the City of West Hollywood is only the second city in the United States to publicly denounce the great injustice same-sex binational couples face under current law.

Tokyo Includes Gays in Rights

After catching flack for removing homosexuality from its guidelines for human rights, the Tokyo government has seen the light and may become the first Asian city with such protections for gays and lesbians.

The Japan Times reported that on November 21 the government of Tokyo bowed to public pressure and decided to put the term "homosexuals" back in its human rights guidelines. "The term had been scrapped from the draft guidelines unveiled for public comment in June on the grounds that various surveys indicated that Tokyo citizens 'do not fully understand' homosexuals," reported the Times. But international human rights groups sharply criticized the exclusion of sexual orientation, and the majority of Japanese citizens who expressed opinions on the issue believed it should be reinstated.

Gays and lesbians were included in the process of developing the human rights guidelines for Tokyo, and the advisory commission included their concerns in its report. So it was a surprise when homosexuality did not appear in the draft published in June. When Tokyo's Governor Shintaro Ishihara was asked about the omission at a press conference, he responded, "In what way are they discriminated against?"

According to the Times, though, the final version of the document = recognizes that sexual minorities suffer disc r i m i n a t i o n .

In an October 9 letter to the city's government, the International Lesbian and Gay Association (ILGA) said, "The city of Tokyo has a unique opportunity to become the first Asian city to enforce a human rights policy protecting gay and lesbian human rights. We hope that your government will see the importance of our appeal and adopt a human rights policy for its population in accordance with the international recognition of human rights for all."

"Kissing and Herpes Virus'' Washington Post (11/09/00) P. A8 New findings published in today's New England Journal of Medicine (2000;343:1369-1377) show that a form of herpes virus may be spread through kissing. Herpes virus 8 causes an AIDS-related skin cancer known as Kaposi's sarcoma. John Pauk and colleagues from the University of Washington tested 39 gay men who were infected with HIV but not Kaposi's sarcoma. They found the virus in 30 percent of saliva and mouth swabs, but only 1 percent of anal-genital samples. The research also indicated that "deep kissing" could place gay men at greater risk for the virus.

"'Blackspot' Vietnam Expects 46,000 AIDS Deaths"

Reuters (www.reuters.com) (11/29/00) New figures from Vietnam's Health Ministry forecast that unless aggressive measures are taken, more than 46,000 people will die from AIDS and another 200,000 will be diagnosed with HIV within five years. The statistics are in sharp contrast to the nearly 2,400 AIDS deaths and the 27,000 HIV infections the ministry previously reported. A report in Wednesday's official Vietnam News newspaper quoted the ministry as declaring the nation to be in the first stages of an epidemic of HIV and AIDS. UNAIDS estimates that 107,000 people in Vietnam are infected with HIV, nearly two-thirds of whom are injection drug users.





couples separated," said Chris Haiss, cochair of Immigration Equality, an organization who helped sponsor the resolution. "Tragically, under current U.S. immigration law there is no possibility for a U.S. citizen to sponsor his or her foreign samesex partner for residency."


Although the resolution wouldn't change federal laws, it sends out a strong message of hope for those couples that live under constant fear of being torn apart, and, in the worst scenario, having the foreign partner deported.

The Xinhua news agency, quoting the health ministry, said that most of the new HIV infections were among people between the ages of 20 and 29, with injection drug users accounting for 72 percent of cases.
