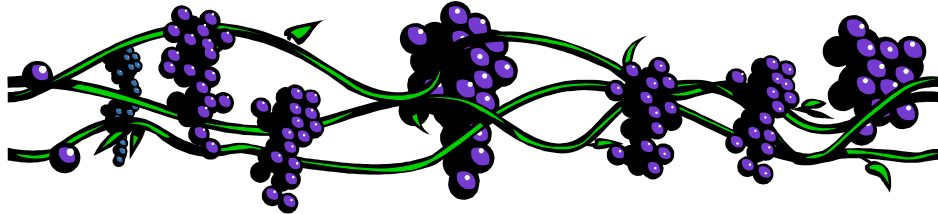

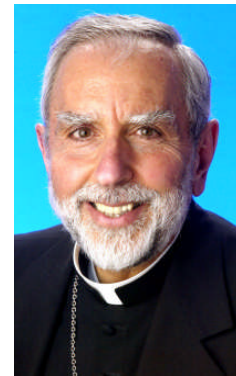

The Constitution of the Sacred Liturgy is the guiding document for the liturgical renewal in the Church. Article #23 states, "...care must be taken that any new forms adopted should in some way grow organically from forms already existing." In the Spring of 2006 the United States Bishops submitted to Rome their suggestions for an organic pruning of the language of the liturgy. Pruning always precedes new growth.
