Congratulations on the acceptance of your research paper proposal. **A condition of acceptance is to provide your complete research paper in PDF format by June 17, 2005.** All papers will be posted on the NECC Web site and available to the public.

Authors maintain the copyright to their papers and are free to submit them for further publication. Authors are encouraged to add the copyright symbol and appropriate statement to the research paper PDF.

Papers will not be edited nor formatted. Please carefully edit and proof your paper.

Papers will be archived and available to the public for two years after the conference.

Paper authors addressing Teacher Education who wish to be considered for ISTE's SIGTE Research Paper Award of Excellence must submit their paper by **APRIL 18, 2005**. A one-hour session will be awarded to the winner in addition to their currently scheduled paper presentation. The winner will be contacted mid May. E-mail was sent mid-March to those authors whose papers will be considered for this award.

If you are presenting in the Roundtable format, please note that you will not have a computer or projection equipment. It is suggested that you bring a minimum of 10 handouts or plan to use your laptop to present key findings from your paper. Electricity will not be available.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR SUBMITTING YOUR PAPER

All papers must be uploaded via the NECC Web site in PDF format using the handouts/paper upload feature which will open approximately April 7 under the "For Presenters" link on the NECC home page (www.iste.org/necc).

- **Target length of 3,200–4,800 words**
- Include contact information. Be sure to list the main presenter's name and contact information after the title and before all co-authors. Remember this information will appear on the NECC Web site.
- Include 3–7 key words, and bibliographic references.
- Be sure to insert any graphics/tables *within* the text if your paper includes graphics/tables.
- Please carefully edit and proof your paper.
