

Taxpayer Group WILL RATE a VOTE AGAINST H.R. 800, "Baseball Bats for Big Labor Act"

This week, the U.S. House of Representatives will consider H.R. 800. This bill strips workers of their right to a federally-supervised, private ballot election when deciding on union representation. It would replace private ballots with public "card check" schemes that leave worker decisions known to workers' bosses, union organizers, and co-workers.

H.R. 800 rigs the rules in favor of the unions and against workers. Taxpayers know that unions are increasingly little more than agitators for their membership, government bureaucrats. As unions increase, so does the size of government and the tax burden.

In a recent poll by McLaughlin and Associates, 87% of likely voters said that workers should retain this private ballot right. The American people have it right. Does Congress?
