The Bible tells us about some of Jesus' special friends: Mary and her sister Martha. He loved them very much. He liked to go to their house to have supper and talk. Their house was one of the places He went to get away from the big crowds that followed Him.

Jesus loved both Mary and Martha, but Mary had a very special place in His heart. When Jesus came to spend time at her house, Mary would sit at His feet and hang on every word Jesus said . . . while Martha kept busy with the cooking and cleaning. The Bible says that Mary spent her time *listening* to Jesus, but Martha was *distracted* (Luke 10:39-40). Martha even complained to Jesus, asking Him to make Mary help her with the dinner preparations. Jesus told Martha that Mary's choice to spend time **seeking** and listening was best.

One time, Mary and Martha's brother Lazarus got very sick (John 11:1-44). The

sisters sent word to Jesus, asking Him to come heal their brother. By the time Jesus finally arrived, however, Lazarus had died and had been in his grave four days.

Mary and Martha both grieved about their brother's death. They both talked to Jesus about it, even saying the same things. But when Mary saw Jesus, she fell at His feet. Jesus saw how very sad Mary was, and He cried. Then He did a miracle—He brought Lazarus back to life! It's no surprise that after that, many of Mary's friends put their faith in Jesus.

What was the difference between Mary and Martha? Both of them spent time with Jesus. Both of them loved Him, and He loved them. So how did Mary become one of Jesus *best* friends? The Bible tells us that Mary understood what Jesus was saying, even when His disciples didn't seem to (John 12:4-7). She didn't just listen. She took pleasure and delight in finding the hidden truth in what Jesus was saying.

When Martha spent time with Jesus, she was also busy with other plans and details. When Mary was with Him, she listened, focused all her attention on Him, and sat at His feet in worship. She was **seeking God** with all her heart.

That's the kind of best friend Jesus is looking for. You can be one of His *best* friends too. Listen to Him! Focus all your attention on Him! Worship Him! When you're **seeking Him** with all your heart, you'll find Him and He'll find you! ★

One place you can seek God is in His Word. When you want to worship Him and tell Him how much He means to you, you can use His own words from the Bible.


You can also use the Bible to help you hear what's on God's heart, because that's one of the ways He talks to us.

One way to seek Jesus is to turn Bible verses into a prayer conversation with Him. Here is an example from Psalm 27:4,8: "Lord, my heart says to me, 'Seek His face!' And I do want to seek Your face, Lord more than anything! I want to spend time gazing at how beautiful You are! I want to spend time where You are, just enjoying You."

Now try turning these verses into conversations that **seek Jesus**: Isaiah 45:3; Jeremiah 29:13, 33:3; James 4:8a. ★

Praying with Your Body

Did you know that your body can seek God along with your spirit and voice? God gave you your body, and He loves it when you use it to communicate with Him! You can use many different positions, or "postures," when you pray. Each one is a way of showing God what is in your heart and asking Him to meet you there.



Kneeling shows God that you are entering into His presence or asking Him for something (and you accept

that He will answer in the way He knows is best for you).

Standing shows God that you are ready for "marching orders" and that you are waiting for Him to tell you what to do.

Uplifted Hands show God that you are reaching toward Him in praise or asking for something with arms open to receive it.

Walking shows God that you are "on the move" for Him and ready for His directions or battle plans. **Bowing** shows God that you honor Him and feel humble because He's so good and big and powerful.



Prostrate (lying flat on your face or back) shows

God that you are in awe of Him and are desperate and hungry for Him to come and be with you.

Next time you **seek God**, try a new prayer posture. Ask Him how He wants you to approach Him. Then choose the prayer position that fits. You'll be surprised at how God will meet you right where you are.

Picture Perfect

It's great to find ways to tell God how much you love Him, like painting Him a picture or singing Him a song.

But did you know that God is busy doing those same things for you? He is always trying to get your attention. He wants you to **seek Him**, to look for Him everywhere. He paints a new sunset and sunrise every day, just to let you know He's thinking of you. He gives the bird outside your window a special song because He knows you will enjoy it. God even put the grass and flowers beneath your feet for you to enjoy.

Think of all the things Jesus uses to get you to **seek Him.** Often, these are things you take for granted! If you can, take a nature hike. Go to a nearby park or just look out your window. Look at something God created (the clouds, a flower, snowflakes, a butterfly) and soak in its beauty.

List all the things you see and how they remind you of God. Then spend time thanking Him for His creation—and that He leaves clues that help you to seek Him. ★

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Five Days of Seeking A Family Bible Study

The Bible tells of many people who loved **seeking God.** They worshiped Him with all their hearts, and He revealed Himself to them in very special ways. You and your family can learn about **seeking God** as you work through this Bible study.

D A Y

The book of Revelation is a breathtaking book about heaven and the end of time. God revealed it to John by sending an angel who showed him mysteries that no human being ever had seen before. Let's look at the special friendship John had with Jesus.

- Read John 13:23-25. "The disciple whom Jesus loved" refers to John himself. Where did John choose to sit, and in what way did John demonstrate his special friendship with Jesus?
- Read John 19:25-27. It must have been heartbreaking to watch Jesus suffer and die, yet John stayed with Jesus to the very end. How did Jesus show that He viewed John as a special and trustworthy friend?
- Read Revelation 1:10, in the *New Living Translation*, if possible. What day was it, and what was John doing when God began showing him wonderful things about the future?

D A Y 2

Just as we wait in expectation for Jesus to return to earth, there were people long ago who were **seeking God** and waiting expectantly for Jesus to come to earth the first time. One of these people got the privilege of seeing Jesus when He was only eight days old: a very old lady named Anna.
Read Luke 2:36-38. What do you learn about Anna's life? Of the thousands of people who lived in Jerusalem at the time of Jesus' birth, why do you think God chose Anna to recognize Him? After she saw Jesus, who did Anna tell about Him?



When we **seek God** in spite of our troubles, He sometimes surprises us in special ways.

- Read Acts 16:22-30. Where were Paul and Silas? How would you feel if the things that happened to them happened to you? What were Paul and Silas doing when the miraculous earthquake took place? What blessings did they experience?
- Read Luke 13:10-17. If you were badly crippled for 18 years, it might seem like a good reason not to go to church and worship. But worshiping God was important enough to this woman that she made the effort to go to the synagogue. Did she ask Jesus to heal her? What happened to her? What was her immediate response to God's miracle in her life?



• Read Acts 10:1-8 and 23-48. What was Cornelius' life like? What was he

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

doing when the angel of God came to him? What happened as a result of the way he was **seeking God?**



- Read 1 Kings 3:4-5. What was Solomon doing when the Lord appeared to him in a dream? Why do you think Solomon did this? How did the Lord show Solomon great favor?
- Read Luke 1:8-17. What was Zechariah doing when the angel of the Lord appeared to Him? What were the people doing outside while he was inside?

Did you notice all the times God blessed people in wonderful ways when they specifically set out to **seek Him?** How will this change the way you and your family worship Him and pray?
