Give the Enemy a Black Eye


God created you to be a warrior, and He's given you all the weapons you need to WIN! Here are some of the weapons the Bible talks about:

Lucifer was once one of the

highest angels, but he got jealous of God. He rebelled and was kicked out of heaven (Revelation 12:7-9). Now there is war between the kingdom of Light (God's army) and the kingdom of Darkness (Satan and the angels—sometimes called demons or evil spirits—that followed him).




Enemy, Get Lost

ven though I have a mom and dad—and many other people—who love me a lot, I used to struggle with feelings of being unloved and alone.

Sometimes I would have the same dreams over and over again for a long time. These dreams made me feel afraid, sad, and very alone. When I woke up, I cried and felt scared and lonely. I felt like






When I get those kinds of feelings and they don't go away, I know I am in a fight—but not with people. I have to fight the enemy, who is a spirit. When fear and loneliness attack me, I can put on the armor of God and fight.

I ask Jesus to help me. The Bible says, "God didn't give us a spirit that makes us weak and fearful. He gave us a spirit that gives us power and love. It helps us control ourselves" (2 Timothy 1:7, New International Reader's Version). I know I can ask Him for His power and love, because He promised it. Jesus takes away my fear and my feelings of being unloved, and He always makes me stronger. He reminds me of how much He loves me.

Then I tell the enemy to go away, in Jesus' name. The enemy has no right to keep bothering me if Jesus is on my side. I ask Jesus to take away the alone feeling in me. Then I tell the enemy to stop trying to make me feel fearful, sad, or alone. I know my mom and dad love me. I know I have friends. I don't have to believe the lie of the enemy that nobody cares about me. The enemy has to listen to me because Jesus gives me the right to tell him to go away. I don't have to feel sad, alone, or scared anymore.

Sometimes I still have bad thoughts and dreams, but I know what to do. I pray—right out loud! The enemy has to listen to Jesus, and Jesus lives in me! So when you are scared or lonely, you can just do what I did. Ask your mom and dad to pray with you. Jesus will answer your prayer, and you won't feel so scared and alone. *\times

when they think about fighting Satan. But guess what? God created you to be a warrior, and He's given you weapons to help you fight and win! His Word, also called the "Sword of the Spirit," is one of them. When you take God's Word and turn it into a prayer, you are using that powerful weapon against the devil and his army of darkness. It tells Satan that you know he's already been beaten because of Jesus.


You can use the Sword of the Spirit for your family, school, yourself, or even for people around the world. Satan hates it when you pray God's Word!

Here is a prayer from Isaiah 54:17 that you can use to wage war against the enemy:

"Lord, You've promised that no weapon Satan tries to use against me can win. So when he tries to trick me or make me feel bad, help me remember that You can prove false anything he says. Thank You for protecting me like this because I'm Your servant. I'm so glad that You've chosen to save me and use me in the battle!"

he River

"What are they doing?" I whispered to my friend Matthew as I came up beside the group.

"That's Paul. He's here in Philippi baptizing families in the name of someone named Jesus. People are coming from all over to see him. Watch!" Matthew did not take his eyes off the men in the river.

I knew who Jesus was. And I knew who Paul was, too. My mother had told me about Paul's teaching. We all sat now and watched Paul baptize entire families. The words he was saying had a lot of strength and power. I wanted to hear more.

Cassandra, a girl about my age, was running after Paul and his friends. She was shouting, "These men are servants of the Most High God who are telling you the way to be saved."

We watched a little longer as Cassandra went after Paul. People in their houses and along the road stopped and watched, too. No one spoke a word. Cassandra was a slave girl who belonged to some people who lived in the city. Mama told me that Cassandra's owners made her talk to evil spirits and tell people's fortunes in exchange for money. We had prayed for Cassandra once when we passed her on our way to the city gate. She had been on her knees, just inside the entrance of her tent, swaying back and forth and speaking in words we could not understand. Mama prayed that the evil spirits would not torment her. We prayed that the fortune-telling spirit would leave her.

"Why is she shouting at Paul, Mama? Why is he not stopping to talk to her?" I asked again.

"What she is saying is true," Mama explained. "But the devil is trying to use her to stop Paul from teaching people about Jesus. He wants people to think that Paul is connected to Cassandra and her fortune telling. He wants people to think Paul is evil so they won't believe what he says about Jesus.

Cassandra was getting louder and louder and mov-

ing closer and closer to Paul. Paul finally stopped in his tracks. I took a breath and held it, not sure what would happen next.

Paul lifted his face toward the sky. "Lord, even the demons submit to us in Your name,"

he said. "I have all authority to trample on snakes and scorpions and to overcome all the power of the enemy! I will not allow the enemy to torment this girl another day!"

At that moment, Paul spun around to face Cassandra. "In the name of Jesus Christ, I command you to come out of her!" As soon as he shouted the words, Cassandra fell to the ground, and the evil spirit left her.

We never saw Cassandra near the city gates again. In fact, the only place we ever saw her was standing on the riverbank, telling the story of how the power of Jesus set her free.

Don't Fall for Lies!

One of the ways Satan tries to get a foothold in our lives is by getting us to think wrong thoughts. The Bible says that sin doesn't start with an action—it starts with a thought or desire (James 1:14). The enemy knows that if he can get us thinking the wrong way, he can gain a hold on our actions (see Ephesians 4:26-27).

A wrong thought is any thought, idea, or feeling that goes against God's truth. Look at each of the following examples. Then look up the Bible verses and see what the truth is. Jesus said that when we know the truth, it will set us free (John. 8:32)!

Let's Pray for Animists


People in many parts of the world believe that spirits exist in trees, rocks, mountains, rivers, and animals. These people are called animists.

Animists worship evil spirits because they fear that something bad might happen to them and their family members if the spirits get mad. They believe evil spirits could bring sickness, death, a terrible accident, or a natural disaster such as an earthquake, tidal wave, or famine. They make sacrifices (kill an animal) to the evil spirits to try to make the spirits happy with them. This is one of Satan's favorite tricks: He loves to make people worship him by keeping them in fear.

Animists put charms on the wrists, ankles, waists, or necks of babies when they are born to try to protect them from evil and sickness. They also put fetishes (strands of goat hair, bones, feathers, or other small objects) over their doors or in rocks or trees to try to get magical power from them.

How You Can

Pray for Animists:



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Pray that animists will seek to know the Creator-God. The Bible says people everywhere can know God through His creation (Romans 1:20).

Pray that people will be willing to go as missionaries to the places where animists live so animists will have a chance to hear about Jesus (Romans 10:14-15).

Pray that Satan will be unable to blind the spiritual eyes of animists, so they can be set free from what's keeping them in darkness (Isaiah 42:7; 2 Corinthians 4:4).

Pray that animists will realize that there is only one sacrifice that can really save them and take away their sins—Jesus (Hebrews 7:27).

Pray that animists will come to know Jesus as the way, the truth, and the life and be freed from fear and Satan's hold on them (John 8:32, 14:6).

Pray that animists will see miracles and healings performed in Jesus' name, causing them to believe in Him (Psalm 77:14).

"T.H.U.M.B." cards are a great PrayKids! resource to help you pray for people around the world. "T.H.U.M.B." stands for Tribal, Hindu, Unreligious, Muslim, and Buddhist. Call(800)366-7788 or (719) 548-9222, and ask for Item #22 (\$3 per set). The Tribal card shows more ways to pray for animists.

animists also worship their ances-

tors (family members who have died), hoping that these spirits from the dead won't make bad things happen to the living.

When animists become Christians, they usually destroy their idols, fetishes, and charms as an act of spiritual warfare. Once they know Jesus, they realize that they no longer need these things because He protects them and saves them from their fears.



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Clean Those Dark Corners

Your family's home, as well as your lives, is an important reflection of the presence of Christ. Your possessions are a part of that.

In Joshua 7, a man named Achan hid forbidden things in his tent that dishonored God.
His "stash" made God angry. Israel's enemy was strengthened, and Israel ended up losing what should have been an easy battle. Like Achan, many of us have things in our homes that give strength to the enemy.

As parents, we can practice powerful **spiritual warfare** simply by ridding our homes of things that dishonor the Lord. Some of us have inadvertently allowed our children to use violent games or video games that glorify the demonic. Altough there is debate in Christian circles about popular products that glorify the occult, the Bible has much to say about occult practices—see Leviticus 20:27 and Deuteronomy 18:10-12.

It's your choice; but why allow



anything that even possibly opens a door to evil? When it comes to our children, we must take special care to teach them the truths of **spiritual warfare** without causing fear or provoking an unwise interest in spiritual darkness.

How do we start cleaning house? First, pray! Ask the Lord to reveal to you anything in your home that reflects the nature of the enemy or would attract him or make him feel at home. Walk through each room and look through each drawer, cabinet, and closet. Throw away materials and objects related to astrology, false religions, and secret societies. Also look for demonic jewelry, art, videos, music, furniture, or anything

that depicts extreme violence. Such things, which violate God's love, joy, and peace, should be removed from your home.


What about our children's possessions? Many children are quite sensitive to the Lord. They are capable of praying over their own possessions and deciding what honors Christ and what doesn't. Encourage your child to ask God to reveal anything that displeases Him. Pray with your child and support what God tells him or her, even if it means tossing out an expensive toy or video game.

What if you're not sure about a particular item? Shine the light of Philippians 4:8 on it: "Whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things."
