SUBJECT: Summary of Reports issued During Quarter Ending

September 30, 2000

I am pleased to provide this memo highlighting the results of our audits issued during the quarter ending September 30, 2000. This information is provided to enhance our communications with members of the Legislature. A listing of reports issued is included as an addendum to this memo. You may access these reports by clicking the hypertext name.

We issued 11 reports during this quarter. These audits focused on state agencies and school districts where we found that transactions were related to the agencies' programs, were reasonable, and were recorded properly in the accounting system. In making this determination, we noted internal control and compliance findings which need to be addressed by management to strengthen and improve operations, or to safeguard resources. We also noted areas where operating costs could be reduced. Specific savings totaled \$1.4 million. A number of other findings were presented which could provide additional savings. The more significant cost savings items follow.

- The <u>Division of Property Management and Construction</u> could have saved \$478,000 if it evaluated the underutilization of state leased facilities.
- Rescheduling custody officer schedules and moving shift overlap to the least staffed shift could
 provide annual savings of \$420,000 at the <u>Adult Diagnostic and Treatment Center</u> and the
 <u>Juvenile Medium Security Center</u>. When this is applied to all state correctional facilities, cost
 savings increase substantially. Effective July 1, 2000 shift overlap has been eliminated from the
 Senior Correction Officers' union contracts.
- Discontinuing the printing and mailing of Electronic Fund Transfer stub statements to retirees could save the pension funds at the <u>Division of Pensions and Benefits</u> as much as \$400,000 a year.
