

**Discussion Points**

1. Under the federal "No Child Left Behind Act of 2001" (NCLB), certain consequences are imposed on a school if its students fail to meet Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) requirements based on the Statewide assessments and other criteria. These consequences start after two consecutive years of not meeting the AYP standards (at which time a school is identified as needing improvement) and increase in severity as the number of consecutive years of not meeting AYP standards increases up to five consecutive years.

- **Question:** Please provide an up-to-date list which includes all of the schools in the State by school district and county (please include school and district codes). For each school indicate where it stands with respect to meeting AYP for all statewide assessments. For each school which is considered to be in "need of improvement," indicate the number of years for which the school has not met AYP and what steps the school district and the department have taken and are planning to take to address the school's situation and the requirements of NCLB. Provide similar information for each school district. Of special concern is any school for which a school district has to take corrective action. To what extent are the districts and the State prepared for the corrective actions required under NCLB? Has the State set any priorities with respect to the list of options from which a district is to choose to exercise corrective action? If so, please provide the prioritized list of options.

**Response:**

The attached table, *Table 1 A, All Schools Identified for Improvement, Corrective Action, and Restructuring*, provides the list of schools identified as being in need of improvement, sorted by the number of years that the school has not met AYP standards. A second table, *Table 1 B, Title I Districts Identified for Improvement, Corrective Action, and Restructuring*, provides the list of districts, all of which are in the first year of being classified in need of improvement.

Districts and schools apply for their federal entitlement funds using the NCLB Consolidated Subgrant Application. To assist them in this effort, the department issues an annual *NCLB Reference Manual* and provides county-based technical assistance trainings. The consolidated application consists of two components: an electronic fiscal system, the Entitlement Web-Enabled Grant (EWEG), and a parallel paper program application that includes an annual comprehensive needs assessment.

For Title I schools that have been identified as in need of improvement, additional components of the parallel application must be completed. These include a school level comprehensive needs assessment and a school improvement plan. The district is responsible for completing a plan describing how they will support their low-performing schools.

Technical assistance is provided to schools and districts in need of improvement to aid them in the parental notification process, public school choice option and supplemental educational services (SES) requirements. This technical assistance is provided directly by the department's regional/county/Abbott staff. The Title I Office staff provides guidance to the field offices as well as directly to schools, districts and supplemental services (SES) providers.

The NCLB application is completed by the district and schools that are in need of improvement and submitted to the county or Abbott office for review and approval. As part of this process, county and Abbott staff are available to provide technical assistance as needed to districts and

schools.

The department provides on-going formal and informal assistance to districts and schools and has developed six training modules that are available to districts and schools. These modules can be presented live by the county/Abbott education specialists or accessed on-line. The six modules cover the following topics: Title I Program Manager, School Improvement, Accountability, Parental Involvement, Teacher Training, and Scientifically Based Research Programs. Additionally, the Title I Office issues policy letters, sample parental notification letters, a Supplemental Educational Services Toolkit, and maintains a comprehensive Title I Web site.

School support teams work with the 100 schools that have been identified as in need of improvement for 4 consecutive years (corrective action). The school support team process in New Jersey is called Collaborative Assessment and Planning for Achievement (CAPA). The CAPA process, adapted from Kentucky's Scholastic Audit, is designed to assist schools by conducting a comprehensive review and needs assessment of all facets of a school's operation. District functioning is also evaluated. At the conclusion of a week-long on-site visit by the CAPA school support team, the CAPA team issues a report that identifies findings and makes recommendations. The school and district are provided support from the county and Abbott staff to review, analyze and prioritize the findings and recommendations. The school and district then update the NCLB Consolidated Application and school improvement plan, incorporating their plans for addressing the identified issues. The prioritized issues (protocol attached) are specified and an action plan is developed that includes student achievement data benchmarks and targets, as well as a plan of action using scientifically based research models. Additionally, the department has initiated a Highly Skilled Professional Program to provide further resources for low-performing schools and districts. The department solicited applications and resumes from skilled educators across the state. A department review team screens and approves the applicants. Once approved, these highly skilled professionals can be used to assist schools and districts in their areas of need. Schools and districts may use their federal funds to pay for the services of a highly skilled professional. Throughout the entire process, regional, county, and Abbott staff act as resources for assistance to the schools and districts.

Districts in need of improvement were identified in January 2005. These districts were notified by mail advising them of their status and the NCLB requirements of parental notification, fiscal reallocation of Title I funds and the submission of a district improvement plan. The final list of districts identified as in need of improvement is attached.

In February 2005, a statewide technical assistance session was held for the identified districts. During this session, the NCLB requirements were reviewed and the department solicited feedback from the identified districts to determine the type and scope of the districts' technical assistance needs.

Submission of a district improvement plan is included as part of the NCLB Consolidated Application, which was due to the department on April 12, 2005. Regional, county, and Abbott staff have been providing guidance to districts as they complete their improvement plans.

Another session for these districts is scheduled for the end of April 2005. At that time, districts will review their district improvement plans with the three department assistant regional commissioners, county superintendents and county education specialists, with particular attention paid to how the state can provide technical assistance to the districts.

Districts are required to implement their improvement plans no later than the beginning of the 2005-2006 school year. County education specialists will meet with the districts on a quarterly basis to continue to provide assistance and support. Districts may also access services from the department's Highly Skilled Professional Program.

A sample NCLB- School Improvement Plan Application forms and directions are attached. Each school and district completes the NCLB Plan in hardcopy. Individual NCLB Program Plans are filed in the county and Abbott offices and in the Office of Grants Management.



The attached Table 2 A, *NCLB/Consolidated Aid Federal Award Programs, State Fiscal Years 2003 – 2006*, provides New Jersey's actual allocation of funds under each of these programs since State Fiscal Year 2003, the first year of NCLB funding, as well as the expected amount for SFY 2006.

The School Improvement Allocation amounts set aside for "schools in need of improvement" are as follows: FY 2003 - \$10,287,500; FY 2004 - \$5,159,937; and FY 2005 - \$10,268,985. The allocation for FY 2003 included carry forward funds that were not available in FY 2004. In FY 2005, the federal government permitted states to increase the percentage of funds set aside for schools in need of improvement.

**Response:**

Because the department collects this information at the end of the school year, the most recently collected data is for the period from September 1, 2003, to August 31, 2004. During this time, 63 schools offered the school choice option to their students. Of the 557 students who were eligible for the school choice option, 363 selected it. Districts that are required to offer school choice may use 20 percent of their Title I award to fund the option. The actual amount used for this purpose is not currently collected.

In addition, 19,243 students in 263 schools are being offered instruction from a supplemental services provider. As with transportation costs for the school choice option, districts offering supplemental educational services may use 20 percent of their Title I award to fund the option. The actual amount used for this purpose is not currently collected.

Charts 2 B and 2 C list the schools offering choice and supplemental services, respectively.

**Discussion Points**

3. a. Under the "Educational Facilities Construction and Financing Act," each school district is required to "prepare and submit to the commissioner a long-range facilities plan that details the district's school facilities needs and the district's plan to address those needs for the ensuing five years." These plans were due by December of the year 2000 and are due again by October of 2005. No application for a school facilities project is to be approved without a district first submitting a long-range facilities plan. Under section 5 of the "Educational Facilities Construction and Financing Act," the procedure is set out for approval of school facilities projects. The section provides that the New Jersey Economic Development Authority (now the Schools Construction Corporation) is to construct and finance the school facilities projects of Abbott districts, level II districts, and districts with a district aid percentage equal to or greater than 55 percent. Any other district so desiring may have the Schools Construction Corporation undertake the construction of a school facilities project in its district.

- ***Question:*** Did all districts submit the December 2000 long-range facilities plan? If not, please identify those districts which did not. Have any projects which were not included in a district's long range facilities plan been approved for SCC financing? Please provide a list of districts, and the projects in those districts, for which the Schools Construction Corporation is undertaking the construction of the school facilities projects.

**Response:**

All districts submitted the December 2000 long-range facilities plan. The new cycle for the long-range facilities plans is due to the DOE on Monday, October 3, 2005.

Regarding approval and SCC financing of projects not included in a district's original long-range facilities plan (LRFP), the department is not aware of any school facilities projects receiving approval which were not included in a district's original LRFP or an amendment to their LRFP. Approximately 79 school districts requested and had school facilities projects approved as waivers, per N.J.S.A. 18A:7G-4b, which authorized the commissioner to approve a school facilities project application if the project was necessary to protect the health or safety of occupants of the school facility, was related to required early childhood education programs, was related to a school facility in which the functional capacity was less than 90 percent of the facilities efficiency standards based on current school enrollment, or the district received bids on the school facilities project prior to the effective date of the Educational Facilities Construction and Financing Act (July 18, 2000) and the district demonstrated that further delay would negatively affect the cost of the project.

The department's database currently contains 911 project numbers associated with projects in the Abbott districts and those with a state share greater than 55 percent. Please note that the total does not include the 403 Health and Safety Scopes of Work Projects. These were approved prior to the final Abbott District's long-range facilities plan determination letter being approved by the department.

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3. b. Under section 5 of the "Educational Facilities Construction and Financing Act"(EFCFA), each district seeking approval to initiate a school facilities project is required to apply to the commissioner for approval of the project. The commissioner is to calculate the preliminary

eligible costs of each project. The preliminary eligible costs may change through school district appeals or through the recommendation of the Schools Construction Corporation. For a district whose district aid percentage is less than 55 percent and which has not elected to have the SCC undertake the construction of its school facilities project, the commissioner, after considering any appeal, makes the determination of the final eligible costs, which are the costs on which the district will receive State aid. For districts whose school facilities projects are required to be constructed by the SCC, under subsection j. of section 5 of EFCFA, "[T] the authority [SCC] shall not commence the acquisition or construction of a school facilities project unless the commissioner transmits to the authority a final project report and the district complies with the approval requirements for the local share, if any, pursuant to section 11 of this act. The final project report shall contain all of the information contained in the preliminary project report and, in addition, shall contain: the final eligible costs; the excess costs, if any; the total costs which equals the final eligible costs plus excess costs, if any; the State share; and the local share." Following the determination of the final eligible costs for a project which is required to be constructed by the authority [SCC] and the issuance of the project report by the commissioner, the district is responsible for the costs associated with changes made at the request of the district to the scope of the school facilities project. The authority [SCC] is responsible for the costs of construction which exceed the amount originally projected by the authority and approved for financing by the authority provided that the excess is the result of an underestimate of labor or material costs by the authority.

- ***Question:*** For each school facilities project approved to date of a district which is not required to have the SCC undertake the construction of its school facilities project, please provide the dollar amounts of the commissioner's preliminary eligible costs, final eligible costs and excess costs (please identify each school facilities project by school district and county). For each school facilities project approved to date for which the SCC is undertaking the construction, please provide the final project report required under subsection j. of section 5 of the "Educational Facilities Construction and Financing Act." Please provide information on the change orders, if any, that have been approved in regard to each one of these SCC construction projects, the costs associated with these change orders, and whose has paid for these costs.

**Response:**

The department has issued project numbers to more than 2,500 school facilities projects in districts that are not required to have the SCC undertake the construction of their facilities. This list is being provided to OLS electronically. The requested final project reports can be quite voluminous, and the department will be happy to make copies for individual projects available as requested.

With respect to change orders, for projects constructed by the SCC, only change orders that affect the approved number, size, configuration, location or use of educational space are required to be submitted to the department for review and approval, per N.J.A.C. 6A:26-4.10. The department's review and approval does not include the cost of the change order. The SCC submits to the department periodic reports on each project being constructed under its auspices, indicating the contract award amounts, the nature and scope of each approved change order, the revised project amounts and the total costs of change orders approved to date.

4. Since the calculation of State aid for the 2001-02 school year, the department has not used the formulas in the "Comprehensive Educational Improvement and Financing Act of 1996" (CEIFA), but rather has set State aid amounts through budget language.

- ***Question:*** Please provide the amount of State aid each district would have received for each year since the 2001-02 school year, including the 2005-06 school year, if the CEIFA formulas had been used by the department for calculating State aid. Please provide this information under the fiscal year 2002 budget language which provided that a school district would receive State aid in an amount not less than the amount received in the prior budget year.

**Response:**

The department has not calculated the CEIFA formula.

5. The Governor's Literacy Initiative is recommended to continue in FY 2006 with an appropriation of \$6.6 million. This will be the fourth year of its operation. In the department's response to discussion point 7 for the FY 2004-2005 recommended budget, the department provided a table which showed, for each reading coach and school (by district), the percent of students partially proficient on the 2002 ESPA and on the 2003 NJASK4 Language Arts assessment. The department also indicated that the 2004 NJASK4 assessment will be used to determine the impact of the Governor's Literacy Initiative program. A second table provided information on the reading coach assignments for the 2003-04 school year.

- ***Question:* Please update the tables provided in response to discussion point 7 in FY 2005. In addition, please provide the dollar amount the department expects to expend on this program for FY 2004-2005 and how that has been allocated.**

**Response:**

The Governor's Literacy Program has been a critical factor in the increase in student performance at the early grades within the state. The issue of poor early literacy performance was correctly identified in 2001 as a leading factor in the underachievement of segments of NJ's student population. The program has served over 110,000 students, grades kindergarten through three, in 278 schools since its beginning in 2002.

Table 5-A, *Reading Coach Program, 2002-2003*, updates the language arts proficiency information for those schools in which coaches were assigned during the first year of the program, 2002-2003. Table 5-B, *Reading Coach Program, 2003-2004*, provides assessment data from 2002, 2003, and 2004 for those schools in which coaches were assigned during the second year of the program. Chart 5-C, *Qualifying School Placements, 2004-2005*, lists the districts and schools to which coaches are currently assigned as well as the districts in which a returning coach is serving. The services delivered under this program are directed at teachers and, therefore, only indirectly related to student performance, early results (responses from schools and teachers) and test results have been both positive and promising. The department anticipates not spending \$500,000 of the \$7.4 million appropriated in both direct state services and grants-in-aid.

**Discussion Points**

6. Discussion point 8 from FY 2005 asked the department to provide information on the Reading First, New Jersey federal program. In response to that discussion point, the department provided three tables entitled: "Reading First Status: District and School Lists;" "NJ Reading First Schools: Assessment Data, 2002 ESPA;" and "NJ Reading First Schools: Assessment Data, NJ ASK4 2003." At that time, the data from the NJ ASK3 was not available.

- **Question:** Please update these three tables and include data from the NJ ASK3 assessment where available. Please indicate how much longer this federal program will be active in the districts listed in the first table. Also indicate how an evaluation of the impact of the program will be made.

**Response:**

Reading First is a six-year federally funded grant program under Title I, Part B, Subpart 1 of the Elementary and Secondary Act, as amended by the NCLB Act of 2001. New Jersey's 22 Reading First school districts are currently in their second year of implementation (see Table 6 A). After three years of implementation, districts will undergo a midpoint review to determine if funding will continue for the final three years of the grant program. The USDOE Office of Reading First is currently establishing policy on who will make the decision as to whether or not funding for the existing districts will continue. It has been suggested that this determination may be made at the federal level.

Impact will be measured by district's ability to demonstrate a 10-percent reduction in reading failure of students in grades K-3 annually or roughly 27 percent over three years as measured by the Terra Nova in grades K-2, and the NJ ASK 3 in grade three.

No new districts may be added in years one through three. There is an expectation that existing, approved and funded Reading First districts will expand Reading First initiatives to other schools in the districts during the initial grant period, pending sufficient funding from the federal award to the state. After the three-year midpoint review, should districts become ineligible for continued funding, the department may conduct another competitive round of applications.

**Discussion Points**

7. In response to a question for FY 2005 concerning NJ SMART, the department indicated that the Student Registration System would be tested in 12 school districts and that students Statewide would be assigned a unique identifier beginning in October 2004. The department also indicated that a Request for Proposal for the Education Data Warehouse was currently in process. In addition, the department has indicated that NJ SMART would replace 10 major reports and three assessment coding processes with one student-level collection.

- ***Question:*** Please update the status of NJ SMART with regard to the development and implementation of the Student Registration System and the Education Data Warehouse. Please provide the department's plans to complete the transition to NJ SMART by the target date set earlier, October 15, 2006. In addition, please identify and provide information on the cost of all of the current data collection systems, indicating which current data collection systems will be replaced by NJ SMART, and which systems districts will still be required to use after full implementation of NJ SMART. Finally, please provide an estimate of the annual cost of NJ SMART when it is fully implemented and compare that cost with the current cost of the data collection processes NJ Smart will replace.

**Response:**

Because the bids exceeded the funding available, the request for proposals to develop the NJ SMART data warehouse was withdrawn and the bidders were notified. The department, together with the Governor's office and other departments that collect information on individuals of school age, are currently exploring other options for this initiative, including a partnership with the state's major research universities.

There is no separate accounting of costs for the current data collection systems that were to have been replaced by NJ SMART. Nor, given the reconsideration of the projects, can the department indicate which data collection efforts would be continued and their costs to the state or districts.

**Discussion Points**

8. Pursuant to P.L.2001, c.356, the department is to calculate extraordinary special education aid for costs incurred by school districts in the school years 2002-03 through 2004-05 by using a formula which differentiates costs for an individual classified student over \$40,000 and up to \$60,000; costs over \$60,000 and up to \$80,000; and costs over \$80,000, and multiplies those costs by varying percentages to arrive at the total extraordinary special education aid per student to which a district is entitled. The number of applications for extraordinary special education aid has increased each year since the 1997-98 school year, when the number of students for which aid was received was 946. The number of applications for cost incurred by the districts in the 2003-04 school year was 7,212. The recommended FY 2006 appropriation for Extraordinary Special Education Costs Aid is the same amount as the adjusted FY 2004 and FY 2005 appropriation, \$52 million.

- ***Question:*** For the school year 2004-2005, please provide for each district and pupil in that district whose special education costs are greater than \$40,000, the total special education cost of that pupil, the provider of the special education services, the calculation of the aid to which the district is entitled under P.L.2001, c.356, and the amount of aid the district will receive under the budget language on page D-102 which provides the commissioner with the authority to apportion the amount appropriated for any State aid item which is not sufficient to fully fund the cost of that item.

**Response:**

The department has provided OLS staff with a copy of the list, which comprises 8,954 approved applications for aid, totaling \$91,380,499. Aid was apportioned by multiplying the entitlement amount by 0.569049 to meet the appropriation.

9. Budget language, page D-102, provides that "Notwithstanding any other provision of law or this act to the contrary, monies directed to be paid to the Department of Education as a result of settlement of litigation by the Board of Public Utilities or to be paid to the Department of Education in connection with a stipulation of settlement in a merger approved by the Board of Public Utilities are appropriated for the purposes specified in the settlement agreement or stipulation, subject to the approval of the Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting."

- **Question:** Please provide information on any litigation settled by the Board of Public Utilities, if any, that resulted in monies directed to be paid to the Department of Education. Please provide the amount of each settlement and the purpose for which that amount was specified in the settlement agreement or stipulation.

**Response:**

The following summarizes the information requested.

Of the total received, \$2.2 million has been used for the P-12 Higher Education Partnership Grants and Schools of Excellence programs. An additional \$625,000 is committed to the Schools of Excellence program in fiscal year 2006.

**Discussion Points**

10. Budget language, page D-86, provides that, "Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, as a condition of receiving Education Opportunity Aid, an 'Abbott district' shall examine all available group options for every insurance policy held by the district, including any self-insurance plan administered by the New Jersey School Boards Association Insurance Group on behalf of districts, and shall participate in the most cost effective plans. As a further condition, all 'Abbott districts' shall take steps to maximize the district's participation in the federal Universal Service Program (E-rate) and the ACT telecommunications program offered through the New Jersey Association of School Business Administrators, shall participate in the ACES energy program offered through the New Jersey School Boards Association unless a district can demonstrate that it receives the goods or services at a cost less than or equal to the cost achieved by participants, and shall take appropriate steps to maximize the district's participation in the Special Education Medicaid Initiative (SEMI) program, with maximum participation defined by the Commissioner of Education and shall refinance all outstanding debt for which a three percent net present value savings threshold is achievable. An 'Abbott district' that fails to meet any of these requirements may have payment of Education Opportunity Aid withheld until such time as these requirements are met. The commissioner is authorized to establish any additional condition on the disbursement of Education Opportunity Aid that the commissioner deems appropriate to ensure effective and efficient spending in the 'Abbott districts.'" This language is similar to budget language adopted in the FY 2005 budget.

- ***Question:*** Please provide information by Abbott district on the results of each of these requirements, by requirement, during the 2004-05 school year. Have any funds been withheld as a result of this budget language? If so, please indicate each Abbott district from which funds were withheld and the dollar amount of the funds withheld.

**Response:**

As of December 2004, 21 districts received funds: of these, 7 were fully compliant with our regulations, and the remainder were making substantial progress towards meeting our goals as set forth in the regulations. Seven (7) districts did not receive any DEOA and therefore were not subject to the code. Three (3) districts were denied DEOA funds because of lack of progress to meet the regulations.

As of January 31, 2005, the next deadline, 21 districts received funds: at this time, 12 districts were fully compliant with our regulations and 9 were making substantial progress towards meeting our goals as set forth in the regulations. Seven (7) districts did not receive any DEOA and therefore were not subject to the code, and three (3) districts were denied DEOA funds because of lack of progress to meet the regulations.

As of March 1, 2005, the most recent deadline, 23 districts received funds and were fully compliant with the regulations; 7 Districts did not receive any DEOA and therefore were not subject to the code; and 1 district was denied DEOA funds because of lack of progress to meet the regulations.

Chart 10, *Withholding of Discretionary Education Opportunity Aid to Abbott Districts*, summarizes the deficiencies. As of April 22, 2005, only one district, Camden, has had its DEOA payments suspended, with \$17.6 million of the award of \$25.9 million outstanding.

11. The recommended FY 2006 budget, in contrast to previous years, has no recommended increase in State aid for school choice districts. Under the "Interdistrict Public School Choice Program Act of 1999," P.L.1999, c.413 (C.18A:36B-1 et seq.), 15 choice districts have been established. Section 17 of the act provides that "sections 1 through 10 inclusive shall expire on June 30 following the fifth full year of the operation of the interdistrict public school choice program." The 2004-05 school year is the fifth full year of the operation of the interdistrict public school choice program. Section 13 of the act provides that "any student enrolled in a designated school in a choice district upon the expiration of the choice program shall be entitled to remain enrolled in that school until graduation."

- **Question:** Does the department have any plans to seek legislation to continue the school choice program? Please provide the number of choice students per choice district and grade level of each student. Would the absence of a State law permitting interdistrict school choice prohibit interdistrict school choice as an option regarding State corrective action for a school district which has failed to make AYP under the "No Child left Behind Act of 2001" for four consecutive years?

**Response:**

Sixteen districts have been approved to accept children through the Interdistrict Public School Choice Program for enrollment in the 2005-2006 school year. The information regarding the number of choice students per choice district and grade level of each student is provided in *Table 11: School Choice Enrollment by Choice District and Grade Level*, attached.

The department intends to seek legislation to continue the school choice program. In each of the Interdistrict Public School Choice Program Annual Reports the department has recommended expansion of the program to more than the current limit of one per county. The interest expressed in the Interdistrict Public School Choice Program by parents throughout the state has made it clear that there are not enough choice districts and there are not enough seats available in the existing choice districts to provide choice opportunities for all interested students. In addition, geographic constraints have effectively eliminated some of the students in some counties from participation in the program.

The Interdistrict Public School Choice Program is not an option regarding State corrective action for a school district which has failed to make AYP under the "No Child Left Behind Act of 2001" for four consecutive years. The NCLB requires that choice options be available within districts having schools who have not met Adequate Yearly Progress requirements. The availability of an interdistrict choice program does not satisfy this requirement. The interdistrict choice option under NCLB requires agreements between school districts before parents can move their children from schools in need of improvement in one district to a choice school in another district.

**Discussion Points**

12. Discussion point 5 for the FY 2005 budget analysis stated, in part, "Recently, newspaper reports of some of the audits (based on 2001-02 fiscal year data) indicate that serious irregularities have been found in the way State funds have been managed and spent by preschool providers under contract with the Abbott districts. Responses on the part of the providers appear to indicate that the requirements for a financial management system that provides 'timely, accurate, current and complete disclosure of all financial activities in accordance with GAAP' has not been clearly communicated to or rigorously enforced in relation to these providers." The department indicated in its response to this FY 2005 discussion point that it now requires district fiscal specialists to provide technical assistance and oversight on budget development and expenditures and quarterly budget reports. In addition, the department provides budget guidance that clearly delineates each type of allowable cost.

- **Question:** Please provide a complete list of the providers selected for audit according to the basis for the provider's selection since the last round of audits. For each preschool provider, please provide the following information: the school district for which it provides services; the number of children enrolled and the number of classes; the educational cost per child; and the administrative cost per child. For those providers selected for audit at random, if any, what conclusions does the department make concerning the use of a financial management system meeting the standards required by the department? Is there clear evidence of an operational budget that separates the costs according to funding source and that certain expenses, such as wrap around or summer services and the use of ECPA funds, are being reported in a manner consistent with the department's directions?

**Response:**

The Department is continuing to ensure that funds are used efficiently and appropriately in support of high-quality preschool education in New Jersey. The Department, via the Office of Compliance Investigation and the Office of Internal Audit for state-operated districts, is implementing another round of audits for fiscal year 2004-2005. By June of 2005, another 100 providers will have gone through a limited review examination. Of these providers, 90 were selected at random, while 10 were selected based on a referral. Completed reports have been received for 19 providers while another 30 are in the final stages of review. The providers in this year's review range in size from 1 to 16 classrooms and are located in Abbott districts all over the state. Three Head Start providers/agencies are also included. A complete list of providers that are in the process of limited review examinations or have had them completed is attached as Table 12 A.

From the preliminary findings we have received to date, we can conclude that providers continue to have difficulty segregating Abbott expenditures, accurately and completely filling out Quarterly Expenditure Reports, and record keeping in general. However, we do believe progress is being made. To further this effort, the Department hosted a workshop for district fiscal specialists on April 12, 2005. The main focus of the workshop was to present preliminary findings of the 2004-2005 audits and to brainstorm solutions to those findings. As a follow-up to that session, a training module will be developed for district fiscal specialists to use with their providers. A copy of the summary of audit findings is attached as Table 12 B.

- **Question:** Please provide follow-up information on any corrective actions taken with respect to the preschool providers listed in your response to last year's questions.

**Response:**

Many actions were taken as a result of the audits conducted in fiscal year 2003-2004. Contracts were not renewed for providers with egregious findings. Money was recovered from providers in a number of districts where expenses did not reconcile with approved budgets. See attached Table 12 C for a complete list of actions taken.

13. Budget language, page D-85, provides that "[T]he amount hereinabove appropriated for Education Opportunity Aid shall also be used for the following purposes: ensuring that every 'Abbott district' is at parity; the incremental cost of opening new facilities as approved by the Commissioner of Education; and other education priorities as established by the commissioner, to be distributed in the form of grants. Awards for new facilities and approved grants are considered restricted and must be spent for the approved purpose and accounted for in a special revenue fund. Any 'Abbott district' that fails to submit the required documentation or fails to submit its annual audit by November 15, 2005 may have its State aid withheld upon the commissioner's request to the Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting."

- ***Question:*** Please provide a list of the Abbott districts which are likely to be opening new facilities in FY 2006. Also, please provide the education priorities the commissioner has established that will be used to provide grants to the Abbott districts.

**Response:**

The following five (5) Abbott districts are approved for new facilities in the 2005-2006 school year:

Jersey City  
Long Branch  
Neptune Township  
Phillipsburg  
Trenton

At this time, the department does not anticipate issuing separate grants. The department's priorities include (1) implementation of early and middle grades literacy which cannot be funded via reallocation; (2) implementation of improved math instruction, particularly in grades 5-9; and, (3) implementation of curriculum aligned with the CCCS requiring intensive professional development.

**Discussion Points**

15. P.L. 2004, c.73, effective in July of 2004 (S-1701), required school districts, other than county vocational school districts, to reduce their budget surplus in the 2004-2005 school year to 3 percent or \$100,000, whichever is greater, and to 2 percent or \$100,000, whichever is greater, in the 2005-2006 and each subsequent school year. The reduction in surplus must be applied to reduce the district's general fund tax levy required for the budget year.

- **Question:** Please provide a list of the school districts which reduced their surplus to 3 percent in the 2004-2005 school year and the dollar amount of the district's reduction. Please provide the same information for those districts which are required to reduce their surplus to 2 percent in the 2005-2006 school year. What steps has the department taken to ensure that the surplus is applied to reduce the amount of taxes required to support the district's budget?

**Response:**

Attached, Table 15 A, is a list of the 198 districts that pursuant to P.L. 2004, c.73 were required to reduce their 2004-05 tax levy (Form A4F) in the amount of estimated June 30, 2004 surplus over three (3) percent included in their proposed 2004-05 budget. The list includes the district name and amount of estimated June 30, 2004 surplus over three (3) percent appropriated to reduce 2004-05 tax levy. These amounts were based on district projections of their June 30, 2004 surpluses at the time they were preparing their 2004-05 budgets. The statute requires that the calculation be updated based upon surplus balances as determined by a district's audit. Those "audited excess surplus" balances must be appropriated for tax relief in the next budget present to the voters.

For development of 2005-06 budgets, all districts (other than county vocational schools) were required pursuant to P.L. 2004, c.73 to appropriate in their proposed 2005-06 budget the amount of actual June 30, 2004 surplus over three (3) percent ("audited excess surplus") as well as the amount of estimated June 30, 2005 surplus over two (2) percent. Table 15 B, also attached, is a list of the 365 districts required to reduce their 2005-06 tax levy in the amount of the "audited excess surplus". The list includes the district name and amount of "audited excess surplus" required to be appropriated in 2005-06 to reduce tax levy.

The list of districts required to further reduce their 2005-06 tax levy in the amount of estimated June 30, 2005 surplus over two (2) percent will be available in early June following completion of the department's electronic collection of final 2005-06 budget data. This data collection process begins following municipal review and certification of tax levies for defeated budgets which ends on May 19.

The department includes in the budget software mandated for use by all districts a calculation that forces audited excess surplus from the prior year and estimated excess surplus from the current year to be appropriated as budgeted fund balance to offset tax levy in a district's proposed budget. Through edits in the software, districts cannot submit a proposed budget for approval without appropriating all excess surplus as budgeted fund balance.

**Discussion Points**

16. Recommended FY 2006 budget language, page D-102, authorizes the State Treasurer to use funds appropriated in the budget to fund any June 2005 State aid payment that is delayed until July 2005. P.L.2003, c.97, s.1 (C.18A:22-44.2) provides that in the event of a delayed June payment, school districts, under conditions set forth in that section, may borrow a sum not exceeding the amount of the delayed State school aid payment. In addition, this section of law provides that the State will pay on behalf of the district the approved interest on the promissory notes in an amount calculated from the date of borrowing through the date of actual payment of the delayed June school aid payment and other approved costs of issuance.

- **Question:** Please provide information on each district, if any, that may find it necessary to borrow funds as a result of any delay in the June 2005 State aid payment to July of 2005, the amount the district will need to borrow, and the potential cost to the State for interest and issuance costs. Please provide the same information on each district, if any, that found it necessary to borrow funds as a result of the delay in the June 2004 State aid payment to July of 2004. What impact will the reduction in surplus mandated under P.L. 2004, c.73 have on the need for school districts to borrow in the event of a delay in the June State aid payment.

**Response:**

Attached, Table 16, is a list of the 14 districts that borrowed funds as a result of the delay in the June 2004 State aid payment to July of 2004. The list includes the district's name, amount borrowed (principal), and interest/issuance costs, and amount repaid (payment). Information on the number of districts that may need to borrow due to a delay in the June 2005 State aid payment will not be known until after the submission of district applications to the County Superintendent on May 25. Details on the application process have been distributed to districts and are posted on the department's website at <http://www.nj.gov/njded/finance/fp/af/borrow/>. The required reduction in surplus to 3% mandated under P.L. 2004, c. 73 may require more districts to borrow since it has lowered districts' cash balances, but the need to borrow is dependent on district specific circumstances for which the department will not know until after the May 25 submission date.

## Discussion Points

17. Pursuant to section 12 of the "Charter School Program Act of 1995," P.L.1995, c.426 (C.18A:36A-12), funding for charter schools is directly related to the calculation of the program budget of the school district of residence of the pupils attending the charter school. As defined in that section, "program budget" means the sum in the prebudget year inflated by the CPI rate published most recent to the budget calculation of core curriculum standards aid; supplemental core curriculum standards aid; stabilization aid, including supplemental stabilization aid and supplemental school tax reduction aid; designated general fund balance; miscellaneous local general fund revenue; and the district's general fund tax levy." Following the Council on Local Mandates decision, In the Matter of the Complaints Filed by the Highland Park Board of Education and the Borough of Highland Park, May 11, 2000, this section of law was amended and now requires: the school district of residence to pay directly to the charter school for each student enrolled in the charter school, an amount equal to the lower of either 90 percent of the program budget per pupil for the specific grade level in the district or 90 percent of the maximum T & E amount; and the State to pay directly to a charter school an amount per pupil for any student enrolled in a charter school in which 90 percent of the program budget per pupil for the specific grade level is greater than 90 percent of the maximum T & E amount. In addition, as originally enacted in section 12, the school district of residence is required to pay directly to the charter school any categorical aid and any federal funds attributable to the student. The intent of the law is to provide charter schools with funding at a per pupil amount which is 90 percent of the school district of residence's "program budget", and the categorical aids and federal aid attributable to the student. The department has not calculated any of the aids mentioned above since the 2001-02 school year. In addition, most Abbott districts have not increased their general fund tax levy since 1997-98 and pursuant to language in the annual budgets, the Abbott districts have been required to reduce their surplus to two percent. In school year 2003-04, the department provided school districts with Consolidated Aid and in order to fund this aid item used, in part, Distance Learning Network Aid, resulting in the charter schools not receiving this categorical aid in FY 2004. In school year 2004-05, the department provided school districts with Additional Formula Aid and this also was not included in the calculation of charter school aid.

- **Question:** Please provide the following information for each charter school for the 2004-05 school year and the projected information for the 2005-06 school year: the charter school enrollment by grade level from each school district of residence, the school district of residence's program budget amount per pupil for each specific grade level of charter school students enrolled and the maximum T & E amount; the per pupil amounts and total amounts paid to the charter school by the district and by the State pursuant to subsections b., c., and d. of section 12 of P.L.1995, c.426 (C.18A:36A-12). Additionally for those charter schools for which an Abbott district is the district of residence: the Abbott kindergarten State aid amount per pupil and total amount for full-day kindergarten; and the amount per pupil and total amount provided under the budget language found on page D-98 which requires the State to pay a per pupil amount equal to the difference between the T & E amount for a given grade level and the program budget per pupil amount if below the per pupil T & E amount; the per pupil amount and total amount paid for any categorical aid attributable to the charter school students; the total amount paid to the charter school pursuant to budget language, page B-51 of the FY 2004-05 Appropriations Handbook and page D-98 of the Governor's recommended FY 2005-06 budget, that requires the State to distribute \$40 for each student enrolled in the charter school; the total amount of federal aid paid to the district attributable to charter school students and paid to the charter school; and the total amount of parity aid the

**Abbott district receives attributable to students enrolled in a charter school whose district of residence is the Abbott district.**

Pursuant to section 12 of the "Charter School Program Act of 1995," P.L.1995, c.426 (C.18A:36A-12), funding for charter schools is directly related to the calculation of the program budget of the school district of residence of the pupils attending the charter school. As defined in that section, "program budget" means the sum in the prebudget year inflated by the CPI rate published most recent to the budget calculation of core curriculum standards aid; supplemental core curriculum standards aid; stabilization aid, including supplemental stabilization aid and supplemental school tax reduction aid; designated general fund balance; miscellaneous local general fund revenue; and the district's general fund tax levy." Following the Council on Local Mandates decision, In the Matter of the Complaints Filed by the Highland Park Board of Education and the Borough of Highland Park, May 11, 2000, this section of law was amended and now requires: the school district of residence to pay directly to the charter school for each student enrolled in the charter school, an amount equal to the lower of either 90 percent of the program budget per pupil for the specific grade level in the district or 90 percent of the maximum T & E amount; and the State to pay directly to a charter school an amount per pupil for any student enrolled in a charter school in which 90 percent of the program budget per pupil for the specific grade level is greater than 90 percent of the maximum T & E amount. In addition, as originally enacted in section 12, the school district of residence is required to pay directly to the charter school any categorical aid and any federal funds attributable to the student. The intent of the law is to provide charter schools with funding at a per pupil amount which is 90 percent of the school district of residence's "program budget", and the categorical aids and federal aid attributable to the student. The department has not calculated any of the aids mentioned above since the 2001-02 school year. In addition, most Abbott districts have not increased their general fund tax levy since 1997-98 and pursuant to language in the annual budgets, the Abbott districts have been required to reduce their surplus to two percent. In school year 2003-04, the department provided school districts with Consolidated Aid and in order to fund this aid item used, in part, Distance Learning Network Aid, resulting in the charter schools not receiving this categorical aid in FY 2004. In school year 2004-05, the department provided school districts with Additional Formula Aid and this also was not included in the calculation of charter school aid.

Additionally for those charter schools for which an Abbott district is the district of residence: the Abbott kindergarten State aid amount per pupil and total amount for full-day kindergarten; and the amount per pupil and total amount provided under the budget language found on page D-98 which requires the State to pay a per pupil amount equal to the difference between the T & E amount for a given grade level and the program budget per pupil amount if below the per pupil T & E amount; the per pupil amount and total amount paid for any categorical aid attributable to the charter school students; the total amount paid to the charter school pursuant to budget language, page B-51 of the FY 2004-05 Appropriations Handbook and page D-98 of the Governor's recommended FY 2005-06 budget, that requires the State to distribute \$40 for each student enrolled in the charter school; the total amount of federal aid paid to the district attributable to charter school students and paid to the charter school; and the total amount of parity aid the

**Abbott district receives attributable to students enrolled in a charter school whose district of residence is the Abbott district.**

The FY 2006 budget recommends an appropriation of \$267.8 million for the School Construction and Renovation Fund, an increase of \$83.8 million (45.5 percent) over the FY 2005 adjusted appropriation of \$184 million. The latest Debt Service Schedule (Dated March 30, 2005) shows a total of \$198.6 million for total debt service in FY 2006 on Prior Bonds, the 2005 Series L Bonds and the 2005 Series M Bonds.

- **Question:** Please provide an explanation for the FY 2006 recommended appropriation of \$267.8 million for the School Construction and Renovation Fund.

**Response:**

The \$267.8 million FY 2006 recommended appropriation for the School Construction and Renovation Fund supports the debt service and related support costs for bonds issued by the EDA for the school facilities program as well as debt service aid for school district debt eligible under the retroactivity provisions of the Educational Facilities Construction and Financing Act. The recommended appropriation includes the \$198.6 million debt service on EDA bond issues through Series M, along with \$27.4 million for three additional issues scheduled to take place through March 2006. The recommendation also includes the amounts required for annual bond expenses, issuance costs, support fees and interest rate exposure for the existing and projected bond issues, which are not included in the referenced Debt Service Schedule amounts. The FY2006 recommended appropriation also includes \$31.7 million in district debt service aid.
