# Instructional **Programs**

### Make-A-Law!

Grades: 3-12

Maximum Attendance: 45 (includes adults)

Minimum Attendance: 15 Program Length: 30 minutes Schedule: Monday-Friday

Students assume the role of lawmakers and learn the process of bill passage by demonstrating the skills of debate, discussion, negotiation, compromise and voting.



# The State House **Express!**

Grades: 7-12

### Tours

The State House Tour Office conducts educational tours six

days a week. All tours are booked on a first-come basis and are offered free of charge. <u>Attendance</u> limits include adults.

Grades: 3-12 Attendance limit: 50 Program Length: 60 minutes Schedule: Mon.-Sat.

Explore one of the oldest capitol buildings still in use. Visit the Senate and General Assembly Chambers and view historic spaces, art and architecture. Using age appropriate teaching techniques, students learn how laws are made and about a citizen's role in the process.



### **State House Sampler**

Grades: 3-12 Attendance limit: 50 Program Length: 30 minutes Schedule: Tues., Wed. & Fri.

Be dazzled by the splendor of the State House Rotunda. Students are given a brief overview of the legislative process in a committee room setting and become aware of New Jersey's vast cultural and industrial heritage illustrated by special artwork.



### **Rotunda Tour**

Grades: K-12 Attendance limit: 50 Program Length: 15 minutes Schedule: Tues., Wed., Fri. & Sat.

Tight on time? Take a quick peek into the State House. Gaze upward and hear how craftspeople restored the State House Rotunda to its original grandeur. Discuss the structure and discover how domes reflect key principles of democracy.

Please Note: The State House is a working office building subject to unannounced room closings. Dates and schedules may change without notice. Closings are more likely to occur on Mondays and Thursdays while the Legislature is in session. The Governor and legislators do not routinely meet with tour groups.



From Routes 1, 95, 195, 295 or the New Jersey Turnpike, follow signs to Route 29, Trenton. Once on 29, take the Calhoun Street exit. Turn right at the first traffic light onto West State Street. The Capitol Complex is on the right.

**Rest rooms** are available in the State House, the Annex and the Welcome Center.

#### Please Note:

Maximum group size, including chaperones, is 50. One chaperone per 10 students is required. If your group size exceeds 50, please schedule multiple tours. Adults must have official ID (license, passport).
