## Summary of official meetings

**Monday, 15 December 2008**

6043rd meeting<sup>1</sup>

*Briefings by Chairmen of subsidiary bodies of the Security Council*

The agenda was adopted without objection.

The Council began its consideration of the item and heard briefings by Ambassador Giulio Terzi di Sant'Agata, Chairman of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1591 (2005) concerning the Sudan and the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1718 (2006); Ambassador Dumisani Shadrack Kumalo, Chairman of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 751 (1992) concerning Somalia and the Ad Hoc Working Group on Conflict Prevention and Resolution in Africa; Ambassador R.M. Marty Muliana Natalegawa, Chairman of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 918 (1994) concerning Rwanda, the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1533 (2004) concerning the Democratic Republic of the Congo and the Working Group on Peacekeeping Operations; Ambassador Jan Grauls, Chairman of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1267 (1999) concerning Al-Qaida and the Taliban and associated individuals and entities, the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1572 (2004) concerning Côte d'Ivoire and the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1737 (2006); and Ambassador Ricardo Alberto Arias, Chairman of the Security Council Informal Working Group on Documentation and Other Procedural Questions.

6044th meeting (closed) *Peace and security in Africa*

The Security Council met in private. At the close of the meeting, the following communiqué was issued by the Secretary-General in accordance with rule 55 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Council:

“At its 6044th meeting, held in private on 15 December 2008, the Security Council considered the item entitled ‘Peace and security in Africa’.

“The meeting was presided over by His Excellency Mr. Ivo Sanader, Prime Minister of the Republic of Croatia, in his capacity as the President of the Security Council.

“The Secretary-General, His Excellency Mr. Ban Ki-moon, made a statement.

“His Excellency The Right Honourable Mr. David Miliband, M.P., Secretary of State for Foreign and Commonwealth Affairs of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, Her Excellency Ms. Condoleezza Rice, Secretary of State of the United States of America, and other members of the Council had an exchange of views.”

The Chairman informed the Committee that informal consultations on these items would begin on that day, Monday, 15 December, following the adjournment of the formal meeting, in Conference Room 5, under the chairmanship Ms. Elsa Cristina de Jesus Pataca (Angola).

*Programme budget for the biennium 2008-2009* . . . . . [118]

The Committee resumed its consideration of this agenda item.

The Director of the Programme Planning and Budget Division introduced the report of the Secretary-General ([A/63/154](#)).

The Chairman of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions introduced the related report of that Committee ([A/63/594](#)).

Statements were made by the representatives of France (on behalf of the European Union), Switzerland (also on behalf of Liechtenstein) and Japan.

The Committee thus concluded its general discussion of this question.

The Chairman informed the Committee that informal consultations on this question would be held in conjunction with other reports on revised estimates and statements of programme budget implications before the Committee, under the chairmanship of Mr. Henric Råsbrant (Sweden), Vice-Chairman of the Committee.

*Programme planning* . . . . . [119]

The Committee resumed its consideration of this agenda item and had before it draft resolution [A/C.5/63/L.4](#), which had been coordinated by the representative of the Islamic Republic of Iran, on behalf of the Chairman.

The Committee adopted, without a vote, the draft resolution.

The Committee thus concluded its consideration of this agenda item at this stage.
