5xx Introduction

5xx fields

Use field 500 for general notes. Use the other 5xx fields for specialized notes. Use a separate 5xx field for each note. Use specialized notes if additional data or a distinctive word or phrase introducing the note provides access to the record.

According to AACR2 rule 21.29F, notes may be required to justify added entries. If you are inputting I-level records, enter all applicable notes according to AACR2, chapters 1–12, rules x.7. If you are inputting K-level records, most notes are optional. If you are inputting core-level records, include those notes that support identification of the item.

Printing profile

Your printing profile determines printing selection for 5xx fields. The print program selects printing notes according to three categories:

- Contents notes (field 505)
- Local notes (59x fields)
- General notes (the other 5xx fields)

Your printing profile determines which categories of notes are to print on selected types of cards (e.g., shelflist cards). For example, one institution may have all notes printed on all cards. Another institution may have 59x notes print only on shelflist cards and general notes (the other 5xx fields) print on all cards.

Display constants

The print program supplies some 5xx fields with a display constant. Display constants are words that are supplied by the print program when it prints the cards. The 1st indicator value determines the display constant for the field. Do **not** include display constants in the text of the fields.

Display constants may vary for AACR2 and pre-AACR2 records. (The code in the fixed-field element *Desc* determines whether a record is AACR2 or pre-AACR2.)

Note entry order for serial records

Enter notes in AACR2 order or according to CONSER practice. CONSER participants enter 5xx fields in ascending order.

Note entry order for nonserial records

Enter notes in AACR2 order or as prescribed by other approved descriptive convention manuals such as *Archival Moving Image Materials: A Cataloging Manual*. For example, a “with” note is the final note prescribed by AACR2. Therefore, if a “with” note is applicable, enter field 501 as the final 5xx field. (If field 020 is present, it prints following all 5xx fields.)

Notes generated from other fields

OCLC generates notes from fields other than 5xx fields. Whether notes from other fields print can depend on indicator values you use in the field. Use of a field is often dependent on the type of material and format. In general, fields print in the following order with the noted stipulation:

Definition

Guidelines

Archival material and MIX

For material under archival control and mixed materials, use field 505 for the table of contents of a finding aid. Use field 505 also for the physical form (box, folder, etc.).

The structure and syntax of subfield ‡8 is:

Note: Subfield ‡8 is defined differently in field 852, where it is used to sequence related holdings records.

Subfield ‡8 has three parts:

The **linking number** is required. It occurs in subfield ‡8 in all fields to be linked (fields containing the same linking number are linked).

The **sequence number** is optional and preceded by a period (.). It is used to indicate the order in which the linked fields display (lower sequence numbers display before higher ones). If used, it must occur in all subfields ‡8 containing the same linking number.

The **field link type** is required and preceded by a reverse slash (\). It is a code indicating the reason for the link and it follows the linking number (or sequence number, if present). Field link type is required except when subfield ‡8 is used to link and sequence 85x-87x holdings fields. These are the valid codes:

a (Action). Used to link one or more fields with another field to which the processing or reference actions relate. This code is typically used only when there is more than one 5xx field that relates to another 5xx field.

c (Constituent item). Used in a record for a collection or a single item consisting of identifiable constituent units, to link the fields relating to the constituent units. All other non-linked data elements in the record pertain to the collection or item as a whole.

r (Reproduction). Used in a record for a reproduction to identify fields linked because they contain information concerning only the reproduction. Other descriptive information in the record pertains to the original (with the exception of field 007 (Physical Description fixed field), fixed field Form, field 245 subfield ‡h (Title Statement / Medium), and field 533 (Reproduction Note)).

x (General sequencing). Used in a record to make a link between fields to show a sequence between them. The sequence could be one that orders the pieces of a long field that has been broken up, indicates the relative importance of fields within the sequence, or is used for some other sequencing purpose. Use of the sequence number in subfield ‡8 is required when this code is used.

Use for notes pertaining only to the copy of the item located in your institution (e.g., accessions information, local holdings or receipt dates). Generally, use other note fields for notes applying to all copies of an item.

You may define field 599 according to your needs for local processing information. Field 599 provides more flexibility than field 590 (Local Note) because it includes indicators and subfield codes. For example, you may use field 590 for undifferentiated local notes and field 599 for differentiated local notes.
