WorldCat Navigator™

WorldCat Navigator™ is an OCLC hosted service that interoperates with circulation, resource sharing and delivery within your library group and beyond to create a seamless discovery-to-delivery experience. WorldCat Navigator manages returnable and non-returnable items. It streamlines resource sharing processes and lightens the load for librarians by eliminating redundant activities and reducing touch points. The service allows users to discover, view and request items across local, consortial and ILL options in a single interface.

Better access, improved efficiency

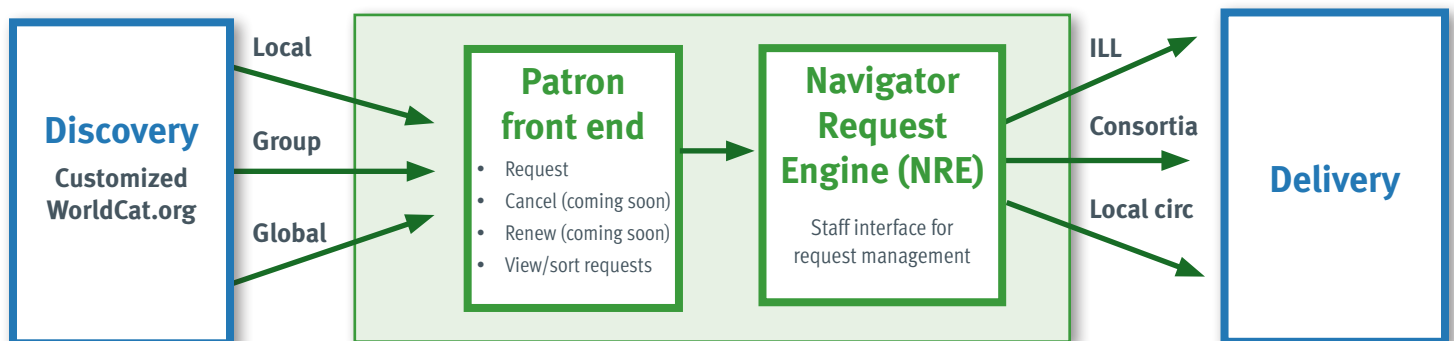
Information seekers on the Web are accustomed to real-time, integrated information flowing and connecting from multiple sources.

Librarians do a lot of leg work to provide access to materials at the local level, and to leverage the value of their collections through consortial relationships and interlibrary loan agreements. WorldCat Navigator lightens this workload by linking catalog data and circulation activities in a more integrated, streamlined system. Local, consortial and interlibrary loan information is shared across connected user and librarian interfaces, automating the discovery-to-delivery process in a way that is more intuitive for users and less time consuming for librarians.

Users benefit from a complete view of what you make available to them, all in one place.



How WorldCat Navigator streamlines the discovery-to-delivery process



The workflow for WorldCat Navigator is simple:

1. End users places request
2. Staff manages the request
3. User receives materials

Multiple search processes are combined into one for the user in a locally branded portal where relevancy rankings are based on group holdings. Wherever the item is held, the process is the same for libraries because of behind-the-scenes request management based on policies.

The link between circulation, consortial borrowing and interlibrary loan

At the heart of this new service is the Navigator Request Engine (NRE). The NRE builds an unlimited lender string based on a combination of local and group holdings as reflected in WorldCat. It then provides real-time availability information to users, and sends requests only to those libraries that can fulfill them. Requests that can't be satisfied within the group can also be sent out to the wider resource sharing network using ISO protocols while remaining within the NRE staff interface.

Patron front end

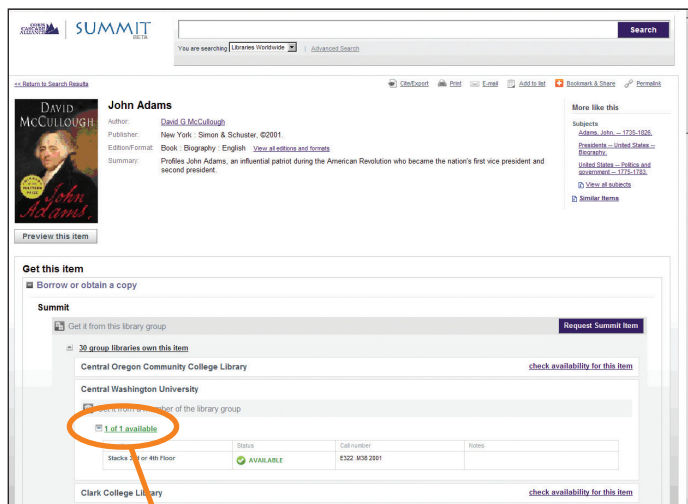
From the user's perspective, the discovery-to-delivery process becomes seamless. Authentication is provided within the discovery interface (either WorldCat.org™ for group catalogs, or WorldCat Local™). Clickable item availability is provided in real-time, and users manage their requests all in the same interface. Relevancy rankings based on local and group holdings “bubble up” to the top of searches, so that users find the materials closest to them more easily.

Staff interface

From the staff perspective, the process of fulfilling an interlibrary loan request becomes, essentially, an integrated part of the group delivery solution. There is no need to manually transfer a request from the local/group circulation system to an ILL product—WorldCat Navigator does that for you. The management of what are, often, a complex set of rules and relationships is relegated to the software. Your staff saves time and can concentrate on higher-priority tasks while still providing access to a wide variety of materials and resources.

Circulation interoperability

The circulation integration features built into WorldCat Navigator automate functions that would otherwise have to be performed by library staff. Rather than requiring librarians to check items in and out of a separate system, the NRE automatically takes actions in the ILS, using whatever protocol is appropriate.

User requests move seamlessly from the WorldCat discovery platform to the NRE, where they are matched to group internal policies. The OCLC circulation integration process interacts with multiple ILS systems and protocols (such as NCIP, SIP, HTML OPAC scraping and Download Port) to send the request to the most appropriate library. No matter what ILS service is being accessed, librarians can stay within the NRE staff interface in order to:

- Request items
- Check out items
- Check in items
- Renew items
- Cancel requests
- Look up users, items and requests

The ability for WorldCat Navigator to provide circulation interoperability with a wide range of systems—including Millennium, Voyager, Unicorn, Horizon and Aleph, with more on the way—means fewer steps for each request and better service for your users.

Benefits

WorldCat Navigator provides a network-level solution for the resource sharing process. It works with other OCLC services, as well as being compatible with a wide variety of other library workflow elements. Over time, WorldCat Navigator will be further integrated into OCLC's Web-scale library management systems, allowing for even greater gains in efficiency.

Staff workflow improvements: Consortial borrowing supports load balancing, requests based on real-time availability and interoperability with existing ILS and protocols. Together with a single interface for consortia and ILL requests, WorldCat Navigator simplifies and automates repetitive tasks and saves time for library and ILL staff.

For end users: Users can find and manage their requests—either returnable or non-returnable items or from multiple sources—all in the same interface.

Library visibility on the Web: Simple Web interface that guides users to local libraries that hold a particular item. It also provides a platform for Web-scale discovery and delivery of library resources and exposes the holdings of WorldCat libraries on major search engines and across the Web.
