Heritage Convention in 2002

Dear Madam/Sir,

It is my pleasure to provide further information about the availability of documents relating to the various events organised by UNESCO to mark the 30th anniversary of the World Heritage Convention.

A report on the proceedings of the International Congress "World Heritage 2002: Shared Legacy, Common Responsibility", held at the Giorgio Cini Foundation on the Island of San Giorgio Maggiore, Venice, from 14 to 16 November 2002 is currently under preparation. This will include reports on the thematic sessions, keynote speeches, summary reports of the nine associated workshops and a list of participants in the workshops and plenary meeting. Following approval of the report by the Director-General of UNESCO, it will be published in English and in French and be available for the World Heritage Committee at its 27th session in July 2003.

The final report of the Virtual Congress on "World Heritage in the Digital Age", a series of meetings on applications of New Information and Communication Technologies to support World Heritage management, held in Paris (France), Beijing (China), Dakar (Senegal), Alexandria (Egypt), Tours (France), Strasbourg (France) and Mexico City (Mexico) is also being prepared. It will consist of a hardcopy publication on a selection of the best papers presented in the Virtual Congress and it will be complemented by a CD-Rom including an exhaustive presentation of all papers, also available on the internet on the following web site: http://www.virtualworldheritage.org
