


Program Objectives

- Protect Communities from Drought
- Protect & Improve Water Quality
- Reduce Dependence on Imported Water
- Promote Integrated Water Management and Regional Planning

- Water Supply Reliability
- Water Quality, Source Control, Desalination
- Water Conservation
- Environmental Restoration & Watershed Management
- Flood Control

Split 50/50 Between DWR & SWRCB



Grant Program Requirements

- Joint DWR-SWRCB process
- 40%-40% geographic split
- \$50 million/project funding cap
- Consistent with an adopted IRWM Plan
- DWR develop standards for adopted IRWM plans
- SWRCB fund development of at least one Integrated Coastal Watershed Management Plan
- Disadvantaged Communities
