### NOTICE OF BOARD WORKSHOP

#### UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK CLEANUP FUND DISCUSSION OF FUND CONDITION, DELAY IN REIMBURSEMENTS, AND SUSPENSION OF LETTERS OF COMMITMENT

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) will conduct a public workshop to receive comments related to the reduction in available funds for reimbursement of corrective action costs for leaking petroleum underground storage tanks (UST). A staff overview on the UST Cleanup Fund (Fund) condition and recent and planned actions taken by the program will be presented. This will be an opportunity for stakeholders and the public to ask questions and comment on the impact these actions have on responsible parties and their consultants and to provide suggestions for improvements in the program. A quorum of the Board may be present. No actions will be taken.

#### BACKGROUND

The Fund was established in 1989 by the State Legislature to benefit businesses, individuals, and the environment by providing reimbursement for unexpected expenses associated with the cleanup of leaking petroleum USTs. In 1992, the Fund began paying claims for corrective action costs. Since the inception of the program through June 2008, the Fund has paid over 60,000 reimbursement requests totaling \$2.4 billion covering cleanups at more than 9,000 sites.

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The Fund's revenues are generated by a storage fee (currently 1.4 cents) for every gallon of petroleum products placed into USTs. The State Board of Equalization collects the fee quarterly from owners of active USTs. Due to high demand for reimbursement payments, a depleted cash reserve, and a dip in program revenue the program has had to take actions to manage available funds in a manner consistent with legislative mandates. Those actions include delays in issuing reimbursement payments, suspension of active Letters of Commitment (LOCs), and delays in issuing new LOCs.

#### PARKING, ACCESSIBILITY, AND SECURITY
